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We have had a fantastic return to school this week. It has been a joy to see everyone again after a lovely Christmas break. Our new learning theme of Ice Explorers seems to be catching the children's imaginations already with several children talking about how excited they are to find out more about it in circle time.

To kick off our geography lessons we planned our 'Holy Island expedition' for Monday (15th Jan) discussing and plotting our route, thinking about what we might see and also considering what we will need to wear / bring with us. Upcoming changes to childcare support

Starting from April 2024, existing childcare support will be expanded in phases. By September 2025, most working families with children under the age of 5 will be entitled to 30 hours of childcare support.

The changes are being introduced gradually to make sure that providers can meet the needs of more families. This means that:

From **April 2024**, eligible working parents of 2-year-olds will be able to access 15 hours childcare support.

From **September 2024**, 15 hours childcare support will be extended to eligible working parents of children from the age of 9 months (2 years in our Nursery) to 3-year-olds.

From **September 2025**, eligible working parents of children under the age of 5 will be entitled to 30 hours of childcare a week.

If you are applying for the 15 hours funding for working parents, this will be available to apply from 15 Jan - 28 Feb 2024. For further information please visit: <u>https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/</u>. If you are eligible you will receive a code and you will need to complete a parent declaration form, please request this from the school office. Any changes in hours you will also need to notify us by completing a change in hours form, we ask for 4 weeks notice for this.

We also offer tax free childcare, for every £8 you pay in, the government will add £2, this can also be used in addition to funded hours. We are happy to help with any information regarding setting this up.
