Eco-School News

This week for Plastic Free July we had a look at a charity called 'Kids Against Plastic'. The charity was set up by two sisters aged 14 and 17 who, after learning about the UN's Global Goals, decided they wanted to take action against plastic pollution. They created resources for schools who are trying to become 'Plastic Clever Schools' to help raise awareness and fight single use plastics. We will be completing an audit of all the single-use plastic we can find around school and in our bins, and thinking about how we can improve this.

We talked about the 'Life Below Water' Global Goal (14) and how plastics impact on sea creatures. We saw a shocking picture of a turtle with a ring carrier stuck on his shell and also learned that they often mistake plastic bags for jellyfish, which they then eat and become very poorly or even die.

We also learnt about microplastics, and how plastics sometimes end up in things we don't expect, such as shampoo, shower gel and even toothpaste! The children were very shocked by this so we decided a great way to start reducing our plastic use would be to replace smaller plastics such as sequins and glitter with something more natural. Eco-Schools Club has a great time using some amazing

cutters to stamp leaves, which made some lovely natural shapes. We then used the natural glitter and sequins to replace plastic ones in our cards for the Year 4 Leavers. We hope they like them! Miss Easten
