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

The children were able to compare the Jekyll garden plants to when they visited in the autumn term and draw on their previous learning as well as from a recent botanist visit for Holy Island children. Next term our main learning theme will be Stone Age to Iron Age Britain. In science younger children will be learning about plants and year 5 will be learning about space. In RE we will be learning about Islam and thinking about what Muslims believe and how they follow God.
