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We are now half way through our first half term of the year and the weeks seem to be going very quickly at the moment. The children have completed some lovely work on 'In Our Hands' which was our beginning of the year text for English. They have thought about how we can 'bring colour to the world', through working together, being caring, not ignoring problems and helping each other.

Our new books for English this half term are Plague and Fire – non-fiction - by Richard Platt and The Baker's Boy and the Great Fire of London – fictional recount/retelling - by Tom Bradman for class 2 and class 1 are working with 'Vlad and the Great Fire of London' Cunningham. The children are also learning about Samuel Pepys' diary in Commando Joe's.



Last week, too late for the newsletter, the children visited Pippa's garden to have their forest school afternoon learning about what she grows and how she grows things. They were very interested in her polytunnels and also that she uses the '3 sisters' growing technique we learned about when we studied the Maya. They also found out more about companion planting. As part of the afternoon, the children were learning about the use of plants, particularly medicinal, culinary and crafting uses. They had time to also do some weaving with willow and try out Pippa's labyrinth. They were able to collect some apples from the orchard and Olive made them apple crumble back at school.
