
so the children will need to have appropriate outdoor clothing for that (either sun hat or raincoat!)


## Stay and Play


Stay and Play is running on Thursday afternoons 1.30 – 3pm for children aged 0 - 4. Everyone is welcome!

Our class books for the beginning of this half term are The Great Wave (inspired by a woodcut by Hokusai) by Veronique Massenot in class 2 and I Live in Tokyo by Mari Takabayashi in class 1. Both of these books fit in with our theme of Asia: China and Japan. In PSHE we will be using Every Family Is Different by Maureen Eppen.







In history we will be looking at the Shang Dynasty from China during the bronze age. As part of this we will be thinking about how we know about the past.
