# 5th December 2025

We are having very busy weeks which are going very quickly at this point of the year. This week has been no exception and the children have done very well. A highlight was on Tuesday when we had our STEM afternoon. The older children were exploring conductors and insulators and started by looking at the operation game and worked out how that would work. Then they decided to make a wire and loop game where they had to set up a horizontal wire to a circuit with a bulb or a buzzer and make a loop that would follow the wire which had an insulator on one end and a conductor on the other end. They all did really really well and created a variety of themed games, including Christmas themed designs.

Younger children were exploring how magnets work. They were working with magnets and made a magnet game - creating a track and a person. They then used the magnets to invisibly guide the person around the track. Well done everyone!























# Live assembly from the South Pole

On Friday we took part in a live assembly from Antarctica. This was a once-in-a-lifetime live broadcast from Antarctica with Robert Swan OBE, and Jenny Cooke, (co-founder of the 2041 School charity). Streaming 600 miles from the South Pole, Rob shared stories from the ice about the importance of protecting our planet's frozen continent. The assembly aimed to inspire young people everywhere to become champions for Antarctica. This resonated strongly with our children who care deeply about our planet and our stewardship of it.
