We will be following up with this in the last week of this term when we will be back on the island on Thursday 7th April. In the afternoon, the children had the chance to do some outdoor sketching using their field notebooks.







This week we also had a successful fire drill where the children were very sensible and exited the school building calmly and through the nearest fire exit. It was our fastest drill yet so we are very impressed at their maturity.

Miss Graham, our student teacher, is working with Mrs Stiansen and Mrs Simpson at the moment. She is enjoying teaching the children in class 2 about measurement, length and perimeter as well as about newspaper reports in English. As an excellent French speaker, she has developed her own teaching unit on a 'typical French day' for the older children.

Next week we are looking forward to welcoming Miss Adams back from maternity leave. She will be working back in nursery Monday – Thursdays. Mrs Waddington has kindly agreed to stay on into the summer term to deliver recovery curriculum tuition to small groups and individuals.

Parents evening on Monday (28th March)


