The lady leading the workshop said she had never seen children produce a better puppet show thinking about the level of detail and understanding the children displayed about their workshop learning and comparing to their previous knowledge. In art and design technology the children will be looking at cityscapes and the work of Gilles Tréhin, an amazing artist who was also neurodivergent who created an amazing imaginary city with detailed history and drawings (called Urville).
