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





Covid update



Eco Club News

For our Global Citizenship topic this week we learned about World Braille Day, which was on the 4th of January. We learned about Louis Braille who invented Braille, and looked at the alphabet and how it is different to ours. We talked about different levels of vision impairment and blindness, and considered all of the things blind people can do, sometimes with certain modifications. We looked at some blind musicians and singers, and B1 football, with a ball which is adapted with metal shards which create a noise as it rolls across the pitch so the players can hear



and locate it. The children noticed that the spectators had to be very quiet! We also all wrote our names with the help of the Braille alphabet which everyone picked up really well! This links well to the SDG's 10: Reduced Inequalities, and 16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions. Well done everyone.
