The children worked together in their houses to create the posters using natural materials from the outdoor environment and mixed media. Eco-School News

We have had a very exciting week as we have had the chance to show Anne-Marie Trevelyan all our hard work! At Eco-Schools Club and in Collective Worship we spent time recapping what 'Climate Change' and 'Global Warming' involve, and some of the ways we are trying to help. We looked again at the 17 Global Goals for Sustainability and how they are all connected, and watched a short video from Terracycle to see how the waste we collect is turned into recycled plastic benches, planters and much more! This helps because this waste now will not go into landfill or end up in the sea. It also means we are not chopping down trees for wood.







When Anne-Marie arrived, some of our Eco-Schools Club were able to take her to see our recycling bench, our Peace Path, our vegetable gardens and show her some of the work we have been doing on Global Citizenship. We also told her that in the future we hoped to do some Tap, Bin and Toilet Twinning. She thought this was a great idea! We will be rolling out our recycling programme to the local community over the next couple of months and inviting locals to drop off the items we collect at school.
