The Northumbria Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust has announced that it's introducing partial restrictions across all of its sites from 9 am on December 13th after a spike in cases of the serious vomiting bug in the area. This includes a ban on visitors under 12 years old. We will continue to encourage our children to wash their hands regularly and take the usual hygiene precautions.

However, if your child is sick please note that they should not return to school within 48 hours to prevent the virus spreading further. I should like you all to have a healthy Christmas and New Year!
