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We had an active start to the week with Mr Skippy in school to deliver skipping workshops with the children ahead of the skipping festival for years 3 and 4 on 18th July. We plan to visit Bede's world at Jarrow Hall in September next term to follow up on this work and also to make links with our autumn topic of 'Food and Farming' (they do workshops on Anglo Saxon farming as well as about St Bede – it should be a good trip).
