The archaeological dig allowed the children to be very hands on. The children got to work on the site, dig soil, process it and look at some of the finds. The children found out more about the tools archaeologists use – some of them are more high-tech than perhaps they were expecting! They also got to look at replication of iron age clothes and objects. It was a wonderful experience and the children were very articulate in talking about what they had seen when reporting back in the afternoon.

Looking at the work by archaeologists helps our children understand about how we know about the past. We will be looking at the Bronze Age in China in more depth over this term and in particular some of the amazing things which have been found from the Shang Dynasty.
